Overview

At South Brockwells Farm we will be providing a farm-based learning opportunity for children and young people to learn about the vital role of farming in our lives, develop their understanding of where food comes from, the work and skills required to care for animals and essential, transferable life skills.

We will be working closely with children, parents and schools to ensure we are providing an environment where children can feel safe, heard and valued, and are connecting with animals, nature and our environment.

We are offering different packages to ensure the programme meets the needs of our community. Learners may come to us for a variety of reasons such as:

- A particular interest in Farming and Agriculture
- Part of their educational provision
- A lack of engagement/poor attendance in school
- Poor mental well-being, anxiety and self-esteem issues
- Underdeveloped life-skills/a lack of pro-social behaviours

Education at South Brockwells Farm will be led by a fully qualified teacher where students will work with and care for our animals and farmland to improve their 'soft skills' such as resilience, motivation and selfcontrol, confidence, independence and work-ethic that are so vital to their wellbeing and their ability to achieve in later life.




Vision and Ethos

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Why?


We want to engage and inspire our future generation in farming and agriculture and show them the role it has in our everyday lives.

- Maximum 12 learners split into 2 smaller groups of 6
- Half day -1 x 2.5hour session weekly during term time on a TUESDAY morning 9.30am 12pm
- This is a drop off session and parents do not attend (although please do discuss this with me if a phased start is required).
- Learning how to care for, feed and handle our farm animals including Shetlands, Goats, Sheep, Pigs,
 Chickens and Ducks
- Learning how farming impacts our lives and where food comes from
- Guided by the children's interests, our experienced team will facilitate and support children with having fun, developing their animal care knowledge and skills, creating team projects, social skills and wellbeing activities - underpinned by the resilience framework

- Maximum 12 learners split into 2 smaller groups of 6
- Half day 1 x 2.5hour session weekly during term time on a THURSDAY morning 9.30am 12pm
- This is a drop off session and parents do not attend (although please do discuss this with me if a phased start is required).
- Learning how to care for, feed and handle our farm animals including Shetlands, Goats, Sheep, Pigs, Chickens and Ducks
- Learning how farming impacts our lives and where food comes from
- Guided by the children's interests, our experienced team will facilitate and support children with having fun, developing their animal care knowledge and skills, creating team projects, social skills and wellbeing activities - underpinned by the resilience framework
